Editorial ~ More Choices

One thing is certain; the debate over the two major local developments has not stagnated. There are now even more alternatives to consider and I've attempted to summarise them here.

Churston Golf Club Development

1) Bloor Homes continue to pursue their plans to build 90 houses, plus a 50-room extra-care home, on the 1st and 18th holes. The clubhouse would be relocated to an AONB in Churston village.

2) Clubhouse Apartments are a conceptual viable alternative, built above an extended clubhouse in its current Dartmouth Rd location. It is suggested this could stabilise the club's finances and appease local residents.

3) Do Nothing is the option that many locals seem to prefer.

Brokenbury Recreational Development

1) Torbay All Sports Hub (TASH) has been scaled down a bit, but is still a large sports complex, planned by the Sports Council. However, as a local put it "Why build a hub on the rim rather than the centre of the bay?"

2) Residents For Churston (RFC) are proposing a greener parkland style Rural Community Recreation Centre with minimal environmental impact on the area, and in keeping with its semi-rural character.

3) Do Nothing is also still an option.

2011 Census Recruitment

One of the largest current campaigns in the UK has begun as recruitment gets underway to fill over **29,000** temporary part time and full time posts to make the **2011 Census** a success.

THE GAZETTE neighbourhood magazine is helping to spreading the word about the vacancies. However, the closing date for posts was 21st January but may be extended if insufficient applications are received.

A total of **35,000** people will be required to deliver the census, which will take place on **27th March 2011**. The majority of vacancies are for **Census Collectors** who will contact householders to collect the completed census questionnaires and assist where required. Over **29,000** of these roles are available in **2,000** locations across England and Wales.

These roles provide flexibility around working hours – there is the choice of working **15**, **25**, or **37** hours a week, so individuals can fit the work around their current commitments.

There are still vacancies for **Census Coordinators** to lead and motivate a team of approximately **15** field staff and for **Special Enumerators** to deliver questionnaires to organisations such as care homes, hotels, prisons etc., and help with their completion.

These are great opportunities to earn some extra cash close to home, as well as helping out the local community. Information from the census will be used to make important decisions around future policies, planning, services and funding for local communities for years to come.

Road Building on the Common

A GRA Extraordinary General Meeting convened in December resulted in a good turnout of village members.

Exeter-based **Common Land Solicitor**, Matthew Boyer, visited the proposed development site and confirmed that we had a strong case. He felt confident that the GRA and residents of the area could represent themselves at the impending public inquiry, due in Spring 2011. Full legal representation would be unaffordable without substantial additional fundraising. Therefore, residents attending the meeting agreed that up to £2,000 could be used from GRA reserves to pay for legal commentary on our own pre-prepared evidence, and to also pay for a professional ecological survey, which would be key to the hearing.

Longer term there was agreement that the subscription rate should be raised later in the year to **recoup funds expended**.

Although the council have committed internal manpower and funds into progressing the project so far, there is no funding assigned to actually build the road extension. Instead, the council expect funds to be contributed from new housing development in the area!

Stoke Gabriel Road Closure

Those regularly using this road will be aware of initial plans to sequentially close parts of Stoke Gabriel from 17th January 2011 so that a new sewer can be laid. South West Water has set up a website where everyone can keep in touch with progress: **www.southwestwater.co.uk/galmpton**. SWW have apologised for delays so far. We'll also try to post any information we have, on our website: **www.galmptontorbay.org.uk**

The Police have advised us that an existing traffic regulation order means Old Road cannot be used to access Stoke Gabriel Road. Local businesses are, naturally, concerned about the possible loss of trade during the road closure. We understand that they are meeting with the authorities to discuss realistic compromise solutions. The GRA committee encourage everyone to continue to support local businesses during this difficult period.

Galmpton Residents' Association News The GRA and Community Partnership

We are aware from correspondence received over the last 12 months, that there is great confusion regarding the role of the Churston, Galmpton and Broadsands Community Partnership (CP), and the Galmpton Residents' Association (GRA). In this issue of **The Gazette**, we attempt to clarify this.

Role of Community Partnerships (CP)

The Community Partnerships across Torbay are funded and ultimately supported with full time Council officer input. The local partnership covers the three areas listed above. There is a committee structure. The Steering Group and main committee is run by volunteers from the three areas and includes representation from the neighbourhood Police team and local Councillors. Ken Pritchard is the Chair, again in a voluntary capacity.

Community Partnerships provide an opportunity for any resident who lives or works in the area, to discuss issues of common concern. Torbay Council can use the Partnerships to disseminate any of their strategic & operational ideas. They can seek opinion regarding the way in which services are provided in the area, and give residents the chance to comment on these ideas. Council officers and councillors can be called on to talk at meetings. The CP also have an interest in better publicising the area to the wider Bay and laying on community events, funded by the council.

Role of Galmpton Residents' Association (GRA)

The GRA, however, is an independent body primarily dealing with issues that affect Galmpton village or Galmpton villagers. Funding is derived from membership subscriptions (there are currently over 400 members), and sponsorship on the GRA website. GRA has a purely voluntary committee, all of whom live in the village, and has no formal links with the local Council.

The GRA Committee fight village based campaigns, publicise important issues to residents and also lobby a wide diversity of organisations including Local Authorities, Government Departments, MPs and other campaign groups. We lobby Torbay Council and local Councillors either directly or via the Community Partnership. **However, we consider that the main distinguishing feature of our organisation is our independence**.

Although Marilyn Everitt represents the GRA on the CP Steering group, the CP agenda obviously differs from GRA's. We see our role as one of ensuring that the CP is kept aware of, and ideally support, our village based campaigns. Whilst we are also keen to work with, and collaboratively support our neighbouring communities, **our priority always is Galmpton**.

Residents Against Golf Club Sell-off R.A.G.S.

The Planning battle approaches

- R.A.G.S. petition resulted in a Full Council hearing in November at which the Council called for negotiations with Bloor Homes to be stopped.
- Chris Lewis, the then Deputy Major, deferred taking a decision on the removal of Covenants from the Lease pending evaluation of alternative proposals from Churston Golf Club and other information.
- Chris Lewis has since resigned as Deputy Mayor and the Golf Club reverted to its original intentions and is pressing ahead towards a Planning Application.
- Mayor Nick Bye has been told that he no longer has a conflict of interest and so plans to bring the Lease revision and conditional contracts before him at a Cabinet Meeting sometime in February.
- R.A.G.S. will continue to oppose such a decision being taken, and if it is, we will seek leave for a Judicial Review in the high court.
- R.A.G.S. now understands that Bloor Homes intends to submit a Planning Application after conditional contracts are signed by the Mayor, and we anticipate that this will be in April. This means a decision on the Application will be made after the Council elections in May.
- R.A.G.S. continues to prepare its case to oppose this Application. We have employed an experienced team of Planning Lawyers and we are also working in conjunction with other like-minded organisations, both locally and nationally.
- R.A.G.S. complaints to Torbay Council have still to be answered satisfactorily and may have to be referred by us to the Local Government Ombudsman since it is clear that the Council's complaint procedure is not fit for purpose.
- An alternative to the threatened Bloor Homes / Golf Club proposals was shown at the recent Community Partnership event on 5th January. The Churston Clubhouse Apartments scheme involves the development of apartments only to augment the existing Club House on its present site.
- R.A.G.S. considers that this proposal would be an entirely acceptable alternative for local residents whilst generating substantial revenue and enhanced Clubhouse facilities for the Golf Club. Significantly, the Churston Clubhouse Apartments scheme does not involve development on any open green areas. It is also minimally intrusive and has already generated significant local interest, which we are happy to fully support.

For any other man that would be the whole story. But this is not true for Jesus Christ. For He is not merely a man, He is truly God and man, the only God Man.

The expression, *from the cradle to the grave*, does not cover the life of Jesus, by any means. The Bible is clear, Jesus died, was buried. But that is not all, on the third day He rose from the dead. This fact was verified by many witnesses.

Scripture records that Jesus rose from the dead never to die again. That is why He is God's exclusive Saviour. Jesus Christ rose again to justify sinners. In the resurrection God vindicated His Son.

No one comes to God except through Him, and He invites you to come to Him now. As you read this come to Him, trust in Him to forgive you your sins and Jesus will give you eternal life.

From Churston Vicarage

I had an interesting chat with a youngster the other day, who asked me how it was that Jesus did all he had to do when only a few months old. I had to get him to explain further, because I could not understand the question. He went on to explain that we celebrate Jesus' birth at the end of December, and his death at Easter, which is only 3 or 4 months later, so how did he fit all that he had to do in such a short time? Once we understood each other it was quite easy to explain that Jesus was born in one year but died several years later.

However, the question stayed with me, because it made me think about how little we know of Jesus' life. His public ministry seems to have lasted only about three years, and our knowledge of what he said and did is chiefly based on four relatively short books written by his friends, after his death. He himself wrote nothing except a few marks in the sand one day. Yet, on even such a small amount of knowledge, our whole world has changed. For example, there are estimated to be 1,500 million Christians in our world today. These followers are to be found in every country, speaking many different languages. Over the years since his death, countless thousands have devoted their lives in his service, and indeed many have faced persecution and been killed for speaking about him.

With that in mind, I have to ask "Do you know enough about Jesus and his teachings?" If you want to know more, why not come to Church and find out, or join one of our Lent study groups. But be warned it could change your life.
